

## Angulalik Time Line Cards – Teacher Copy

The following pieces of information give some of the important events in Stephen Angulalik's life. To put the cards in order, the students may need to refer to the website. The underlined places indicate what the students should be highlighting on their map of Nunavut.

Angulalik was born in the area of <u>Ellice River</u> on the <u>Queen Maud Gulf</u> .	1898
Commercial whaling came to an end in the western Arctic and whalers took interest in fur trading.	(early 1920's, Angulalik was 22 years old).
The arrival of the independent trader Christian Klengenber marked the beginning of the fur trade in the <u>Kitikmeot Region</u> , and was the beginning of continuous contact with the outside world.	Early 1916
The Canalaska Trading Company and the Hudson's Bay Company arrived in the Kitikmeot.	HBC – 1923 Canalaska - 1926

Angulalik learned about the fur trading business by working with Hugh Clarke from the HBC post at <u>Kent Peninsula</u> .	(1923 – Angulalik was 25 years old)

Angulalik again worked closely with Clarke when Clarke returned to the north to open a Canalaska trading post at <u>Perry River</u> .	(1926 – Angulalik was 28 years old)

The HBC and Canalaska trading posts at Perry River were forced to shut down.	(1928 – Angulalik was 30 years old)
--	-------------------------------------

Angulalik became an independent fur trader supplied by Canalaska.	(1928 – 30 years old)

Canalaska sold out to the HBC who then became Angulalik's supplier.	(1938 – 40 years old)

Angulalik was charged with murder. He then sold his post to the HBC.	(1956/1957 – 59 years old)
Angulalik was acquitted of his murder charge and continued as an employee of the Perry River trading post until it closed.	(1967 – 69 years old)
